REPORT TO THE TRIBUNAL:

After the 21st Sitting the parties informed the Tribunal that they were engaged in local level discussions. By letter dated November 30, 2023, the Union informed the Tribunal that the parties have arrived at an amicable resolution of the dispute and agreed that the terms of the settlement shall remain confidential and not be shared with any third party.

On April 23, 2024, the Tribunal received joint letter dated April 19, 2024, signed by both parties, informing that the dispute had been amicably settled under the above terms.

The parties arrived at a settlement as stated in joint letter dated April 19, 2024 (copy attached). The specific terms of the agreement are not included in the Award as the parties did not wish to disclose the settlement.




